Altar Servers

Ushers

Ushers are volunteers who assist with the flow and movement of people and parts at Mass. by opening doors for parishioners and visitors as they enter the Church, assist in finding seats, direct people to restrooms, the nursery or training room, take up the collection, and help find gift bearers.
